 - (i) On Sundays to Wednesdays - 11:00am to 23:30pm.
 - (ii) On Thursdays to Saturdays - 11:00am to 00:30am the following day.
 - (iii) On the Friday, Saturday, Sunday and Monday of each Bank Holiday weekend – 07:00am to 01:30am the following day.
- (3) The provision of regulated entertainment by way of **indoor sporting events**:-
 - (i) On Sundays to Wednesdays - 11:00am to 23:30pm.
 - (ii) On Thursdays to Saturdays - 11:00am to 00:30am the following day.
 - (iii) On the Friday, Saturday, Sunday and Monday of each Bank Holiday weekend – 07:00am to 01:30am the following day.
- (4) The provision of regulated entertainment by way of **live music** on Sundays to Saturdays - 11:00am to 23:30pm **ONLY**. Entertainment by way of live music shall **NOT** be provided on New Years Eve or New Years Day.
- (5) The provision of regulated entertainment by way of **recorded music**:-
 - (i) On Sundays to Wednesdays - 11:00am to 24:00pm.
 - (ii) On Thursdays to Saturdays - 11:00am to 01:00am the following day.
 - (iii) On the Friday, Saturday, Sunday and Monday of each Bank Holiday weekend – 07:00am to 01:30am the following day.
- (6) The provision of regulated **entertainment of a similar description** to that falling within (4) and (5) above:-
 - (i) On Sundays to Wednesdays - 11:00am to 23:30pm.
 - (ii) On Thursdays to Saturdays - 11:00am to 00:30am the following day.
 - (iii) On the Friday, Saturday, Sunday and Monday of each Bank Holiday weekend – 07:00am to 01:30am the following day.
- (7) The provision of **facilities for making music**:-
 - (i) On Sundays to Saturdays - 11:00am to 23:30pm.

- (8) The provision of **late night refreshment**:-

Annex 1 – Mandatory conditions

- (1) No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:-
 - (i) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
 - (ii) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his/her personal licence is suspended.
- (2) Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- (3) As regards the provision of regulated entertainment by way of the exhibition of film(s), the admission of children (ie: anyone aged under 18) must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation(s) made by the film classification body specified (as designated by S4 of the Video Recordings Act 1984 - the British Board of Film Classification).
- (4) Further to condition (3) above, where a film classification body is not specified, the admission of children must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation(s) made by the licensing authority.

Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

- (1) Alcohol shall not be sold or supplied except during permitted hours.
- (2) Regulated entertainments shall not be provided except during permitted hours.
- (3) Late night refreshment shall not be provided except during permitted hours.
- (4) All members of staff shall receive suitable and sufficient training in the requirements of the Licensing Act 2003 to a level commensurate with their duties and responsibilities.
- (5) All members of staff shall receive suitable and sufficient training in drugs awareness to a level commensurate with their duties and responsibilities.
- (6) Anyone authorised to sell or supply alcohol at the premises shall request and ensure sight of suitable identification, for proof of age, of any person appearing to them to be under the age of 20 (twenty) and who is attempting to purchase alcohol. The sale of alcohol shall not be permitted to any such individual where appropriate proof is not produced.
- (7) All external windows must be closed and kept closed between 23:00pm and the end of the specified opening hours on any day.
- (8) All external drinking areas shall be closed to and clear of customers by 22:30pm each day.
- (9) Prominent, clear and legible notices must be displayed at all exits requesting patrons and staff to respect the needs of local residents and to leave the premises and area quietly. Staff must reinforce this request by asking customers leaving the premises to leave the area quietly.
- (10)
 - (i) The licence holder or nominated staff representative(s) must carry out a regular noise assessment of the area adjacent to the premises whilst licensable activities are taking place.
 - (ii) Noise assessments must take place on all sides of the premises at the boundary of the nearest residential premises, and if audible, suitable and sufficient steps should be taken to reduce noise from the licensed premises to a level at which noise from the premises is no longer audible at the monitoring point(s).

- (iii) Written records of these assessments and any remedial action(s) taken should be kept and made available to either the local authority or the Licensing Authority on request.
- (11) The designated premises supervisor shall actively participate in any local Pubwatch scheme.
- (12) Dependant on the activities, events and risks at the premises, a suitably trained first aider or an appointed person for first aid must be present on the premises at all times during licensable activities. Suitable and sufficient supplies of first aid equipment / materials must also be made available to members of the public.
- (13) The last 30 minutes of permitted opening hours (as specified herein) shall in all cases be used as a 'wind down' period. During this period:-
 - (i) all sanitary conveniences on the premises shall remain available for use by patrons;
 - (ii) non-alcoholic refreshments only shall be available for consumption; and
 - (iii) the volume of any recorded music shall be reduced to background levels.
