

West Heath covers the area to the north of the railway line and to the west of Prospect Road. It extends as far north as the M3.



Resident survey results

The last Rushmoor Borough Council residents' survey where result can be produced at a ward level, was carried out in 2022. The survey was an online survey and 1,021 surveys were returned, in total 66 residents in West Heath ward completed the survey. Although not all wards had a representative number of responses the results can give an indication to what respondents in a ward think.

Respondents from West Heath ward feel more that they belong to their local area than those from Farnborough, and less than all those who responded to the survey.


Ward population and makeup 2021




• **Age:** West Heath has a slightly older population, when compared to Rushmoor as a whole.




• **Ethnicity:** There is not much difference between the ethnic makeup of West Heath and Rushmoor as a whole.




• **Religion:** There is not much difference between the religious make up of West Heath and Rushmoor as a whole.




• **Housing:** A higher percentage of residents in West Heath own their homes and a lower percentage rent their homes privately, when compared to Rushmoor as a whole.




• **Health:** A slightly lower percentage of West Heath residents reported very good health, when compared to Rushmoor as a whole.

• **Qualifications:** A slightly lower percentage of West Heath residents level 4 and above qualifications, when compared to Rushmoor as a whole.





Deprivation breakdown

The Government's Index of Multiple Deprivation (IMD) 2019 provides a relative deprivation score for each small area in England, it covers a range of economic, social and housing issues. The overall score is calculated using data from seven domains. Most of indicator data has come from 2015 and 2016 and some of the data is from the 2011 Census. The Indices of Deprivation cover geographical areas that are called Lower-layer Super Output Area level (LSOA), of which there are 32,844 in the country. There are a total of 58 LSOAs in Rushmoor.

Unfortunately, LSOAs and the council's wards do not exactly line up. In West Heath ward there are all or part of six LSOAs. The following map shows the number of the LSOAs in West Heath ward and the approximate percentage of the LSOA in the ward. Each LSOA is ranked in order against all other LSOA in the country, where 1 is the most deprived and 32,844 is the least deprived.

West Heath ward has no areas of multiple deprivation. There are two pockets of deprivation for the Education, Skills and Training domain, these are LSOA 146 and LSOA 122 (which the ward shares with Cherrywood ward). LSOA 121 (which the ward shares with Fernhill and Cherrywood) has a pocket of deprivation for Barriers to Housing and Services domain.
