

# Wage levels data sheet

Summary - Measures from 2022 indicate that wage levels have dropped for those who live in Rushmoor and those who work in Rushmoor. Those who work in Rushmoor earn slightly more than those who live in Rushmoor.


## Wage levels

The Annual Survey of Hours and Earnings (ASHE) is based on a 1% sample of employee jobs taken from HM Revenue and Customs PAYE records. In 2022, Rushmoor residents on average earned £666.40 a week (full time median gross weekly pay). This was £27 less than the average for residents in Hampshire, £19 less than the average for the South East and £24 more than the average for Great Britain residents. The average weekly wage if you worked in Rushmoor was £670.70, meaning a difference of £4.30.

## Time Series

The following chart shows the median weekly wages for those who work in and live in Rushmoor, Hampshire, the South East and Great Britain, since 2003.

**Average weekly earnings for those who live in and work in Rushmoor, Hampshire, the South East and Great Britain**





The 2022 data indicates that wage levels have dropped for those who live in Rushmoor and those who work in Rushmoor. Data for Hampshire, the South East and Great Britain is showing a growth in wages.

## Comparisons

In comparisons to the other districts in Hampshire, Rushmoor has the fourth highest average work wage and the eighth highest median average home wage. Rushmoor is the only district in Hampshire where work wages are higher than home wages.


**Average weekly earnings for those who live in and work in Hampshire districts (in order of highest work wages to lowest work wages) in 2022**

The graph below shows weekly wages for Rushmoor compared to Rushmoor’s surrounding local authorities. Rushmoor has the lowest average home wage and the second lowest average work wages.

**Average weekly earnings for those who live in and work in Rushmoor compared to surrounding local authorities (in order of highest work wages to lowest work wages) in 2022**



In 2022 Surrey Health had the 7<sup>th</sup> highest residents' wages in the UK, Guildford has the 9<sup>th</sup> and Hart has the 12<sup>th</sup> highest residents' wages.

## Males and females

Males who work in Rushmoor and males who live in Rushmoor, on average earn more than females who work in Rushmoor and females who live in Rushmoor. There is a larger gap in income for females that live in Rushmoor and females who work in Rushmoor (£22), compare to the gap for males (£4).

Although overall there has been a drop in median weekly gross weekly pay for both those who live and those work in Rushmoor, the data broken down by male and female is only showing a drop for females that live in Rushmoor. The discrepancy could be due to the proportion of full time male and females of workers in jobs. If there are less jobs and a more full-time female workers, as females get paid less on average the average pay will drop.
