DECISION AND THE REASON(S) FOR IT

Farnborough Airport Community Environmental Fund grant requests from:

- **£10,098 awarded to 14th Aldershot Pegasus Scout Group** for Outdoor Development Project
- **£15,000 awarded to Wonderseekers** for Caterpillar Champions Project

The Community Environmental Fund commenced in 2001. It is levied by Farnborough Airport on business aviation movements at a rate of £2 or £5 per aircraft movement (dependent on aircraft).

The fund is available to groups and organisations under the following criteria:

- Located within 5 kilometres (3 miles) from the centre of Farnborough Airport (taken to be halfway down the main runway) and is demonstrably and regularly affected by aircrafts travelling to and from Farnborough Airport
- Has public access to be available to be enjoyed by the community as a whole and result in the improvement of an outdoor facility or area
- Includes an environmental improvement
- Projects may include: -
 - Green or open spaces
 - Natural habitats
 - Environmental improvements
 - Community projects with an emphasis on improving the local environment

There is £17,686 available for allocation from the Community Environmental Fund.

They also support developing some of the softer skills such as teamwork, curiosity and oracy, skills that are valued in wider contexts.</p> <p>This will engage approximately 300 young people, as well as teachers and their parents if they get in involved in their projects, dependent on schools.</p>

They would also support schools with transport costs (a major barrier for schools) to take the children on a visit to Winchester Science Centre where they will experience workshops, exhibits and our world class planetarium.</p>					
Aim of organisation/group:	<p>Their vision is for a world where, through the wonder of science, people and planet thrive. They have been sparking children's curiosity in science through hands-on science experiences since 1986. In October 2022, they changed their charity name from Winchester Science Centre to Wonderseekers. Their Science Centre remains a hub for science engagement as part of the Wonderseekers family. Today, their strategy is about creating more equitable access to science and maintaining our reputation for leadership in accessibility. They've invested in their team and our Science Centre and reached deeper into communities that needed Their support most. Through their innovative programming they work with children to give them the knowledge and skills to take action to improve the world around them.</p>
