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1. Introduction

- 1.1 The Infrastructure Funding Statement (IFS) sets out how developer contributions from Section 106 (s106) agreements have been allocated and spent on the infrastructure priorities of Rushmoor Borough Council for the previous financial year (April 2024 March 2025).
- 1.2 In accordance with the Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) Regulations, any authority that receives a contribution from development through s106 planning obligations is required to prepare an IFS.¹
- 1.3 This is the sixth IFS produced by Rushmoor Borough Council, following the introduction of the IFS with the amended <u>CIL Regulations</u> in 2019.² As Rushmoor has not implemented the Community Infrastructure Levy, this document provides details on planning obligations secured in the Borough, including:
 - The total amount of money to be provided under any planning obligations which were entered into during the reported year.
 - The total amount of money under any planning obligations which was received during the reported year.
 - The total amount of money under any planning obligations which was received before 1st April 2024 which has not been allocated by the authority.
 - Summary details of any <u>non-monetary contributions</u> to be provided under planning obligations which were <u>entered into</u> during the reported year.
 - The <u>total amount of money</u> (received under any planning obligations) which <u>was spent</u> by the authority (including transferring it to another person to spend).

2. Planning Obligations in Rushmoor

What Are Planning Obligations?

- 2.1 The statutory framework for planning obligations is set out in Section 106 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990, as amended by Section 12 of the Planning and Compensation Act 1991. This is why planning obligations are commonly called Section 106 (s106) agreements.
- 2.2 Planning obligations are legally binding. They enable the local authority to secure the provision of infrastructure or services, or contributions towards them, to support new development.
- 2.3 Planning obligations should only be used where it is not possible to address unacceptable impacts through a planning condition. The <u>National Planning Policy Framework</u> (NPPF) states that planning obligations must only be sought where they meet all the following tests:³
 - Necessary to make the development acceptable in planning terms;
 - Directly related to the development; and
 - Fairly and reasonably related in scale and kind to the development.

What Can Planning Obligations Deliver?

- 2.4 The Rushmoor Local Plan contains a specific policy relating to infrastructure provision (Policy IN1 Infrastructure and Community Facilities) in addition to a number of other polices that provide specific and detailed justification for measures to address the consequences of development, some of which can be secured by way of planning obligations.⁴ These are summarised below:
 - Policy NE1 Thames Basin Heaths Special Protection Area The mechanism for delivering Local Plan Policy NE1 is set out in the Council's <u>Thames Basin Heaths Special Protection Area Avoidance and Mitigation Strategy</u> (as amended).⁵ In Rushmoor, planning obligations are used to secure the provision of Suitable Alternative Natural Greenspace (SANG) and a range of Strategic Access Management and Monitoring (SAMM) activities. These avoidance and mitigation measures are required to protect the Special Protection Area from the adverse impact of additional recreation arising from new residential developments.

- Policy LN2 Affordable Housing
 The Council's <u>Affordable Housing supplementary planning document</u> (<u>SPD</u>) provides more detail on how Policy LN2 will be implemented, including on-site provision or off-site provision in the form of financial payments.⁶
- Policy DE6 Open Space, Sport and Recreation
- Policy DE7 Playing Fields and Ancillary Facilities
- Policy DE8 Indoor and Built Sport and Recreation Facilities
- Policy IN2 Transport
- Policy NE2 Green Infrastructure
- Policy NE4 Biodiversity
- 2.5 The Council will assess each planning application individually to determine whether an obligation is needed and what matters it should address. It will also justify the reasons for seeking an obligation.
- 2.6 The Council has clear internal procedures and checklists for assessing and determining planning obligations generated by planning applications. It is essential that preparatory work on s106 obligations takes place at an early stage. Where agreement cannot be reached on an s106 agreement, the planning application may be recommended for refusal.
- 2.7 It is important to note that all planning obligations secured are collected for specific types of infrastructure as set out in s106 agreements.

What Is the Role of Hampshire County Council?

- 2.8 Hampshire County Council is the local education authority and local highway authority for the Rushmoor administrative area (and the majority of Hampshire). Therefore, it may seek financial contributions from developers in Rushmoor to fund education infrastructure or highway improvements.
- 2.9 Hampshire County Council, as the local highway authority, can use Section 278 (s278) agreements under the Highways Act 1980, which are legally binding agreements between it and the developer to ensure the delivery of necessary highway works as a result of new development.
- 2.10 The County Council has prepared its own Infrastructure Funding Statement

for the reporting year which includes information on the infrastructure that it has delivered to support developments in Rushmoor.⁷

Infrastructure Need / Plan

- 2.11 <u>National Planning Practice Guidance</u> (NPPG) suggests that local authorities should consider reporting on estimated future income where possible.⁸
- 2.12 Infrastructure, the set of services and facilities necessary for a development to function, is defined in the Rushmoor Local Plan as including transport, education, health, social infrastructure, green infrastructure, Suitable Alternative Natural Greenspace (SANG), public and utility services, and flood defences.
- 2.13 The Council has prepared an <u>Infrastructure Plan</u> which identifies the infrastructure required to support the delivery of the Local Plan.⁹ It has also adopted a <u>Green Infrastructure Strategy</u> which identifies opportunities for protecting and enhancing Rushmoor's green infrastructure.¹⁰

Monitoring Fees

- 2.14 The Council has introduced an administration and monitoring fee comprising 7.5% of the total financial contributions offered to Rushmoor Borough Council in any s106 agreement or undertaking up to a maximum of £30,000 for full or hybrid applications and £15,000 for outline applications. This fee applies to any application that was received on or after 1st April 2023 and is payable on implementation of the development.
- 2.15 Hampshire County Council has introduced an s106 monitoring fee of £660 per obligation, within a signed s106 agreement, subject to a maximum fee of £13,200 per agreement, with effect from all agreements that Hampshire County Council enter into on or after 1st July 2023. The fee is to be payable on signing the s106 agreement and paid directly to Hampshire County Council.

3. Value of Legal Agreements Entered Into during the Reported Year

- 3.1 Table 2 details the total amount of money to be provided by planning obligations which were entered into during the reported year (2024/25). This means that whilst agreements have been made, the Council may not have received the funds in the monitoring year.
- 3.2 In total, legal agreements to the value of £147,503.24 have been entered into during the monitoring year to secure the following types of infrastructure:

5. Funds Received before the Reported Year which Have Been Allocated by the Authority

- 5.1 There are funds that have been received by the Council in the years prior to the reporting year that have been allocated to specific projects but not yet spent. In total, £8,436,739.69 of s106 monies received prior to the 2024/25 reporting year has been allocated to a specific project.
- 5.2 For the purposes of this document, 'allocated' means a decision has been made by the Council to commit funds to a particular item of infrastructure or project, and/or the funds have been passed to a team within the authority spend. The regulations require a summary of the items of infrastructure on which the money has been allocated and the amount allocated to each item. It is also recommended that the status of sums that have been allocated but not spent is explained.
- 5.3 It is important to note that developer contributions for Suitable Alternative Natural Greenspace (SANG) are to fund the maintenance and management of these mitigation sites in perpetuity. Management plans for each SANG site provide further detail on the management and maintenance requirements to be funded.
- 5.4 Table 6 identifies the s106 funds that were received by the Council prior to the start of the 2024/25 monitoring year that have been allocated to specific projects.

6. Funds Received before the Reported Year which Have Not Been Allocated by the Authority

- There are some funds that have been received by the Council in the years prior to the 2024/25 reporting year that have not been allocated to a specific project. In total, £693,496.96 of s106 monies received prior to the 2024/25 monitoring year have not yet been allocated to a specific project.
- 6.2 It is important to note that the contributions have been considered necessary to mitigate the impacts of development and have been sought for a particular use, such as affordable housing delivery. The Council is proactively identifying schemes to enable additional affordable housing delivery to spend the monies secured for the delivery of off-site affordable housing.
- 6.3 Table 7 identifies the s106 funds that were received by the Council prior to the start of the reporting year (pre-April 2024) that have not yet been allocated to a particular item of infrastructure or project.

8. Monitoring and Review

- 8.1 The information included in this report will be updated annually and published on the Council's website. This will ensure that the most up-to-date information on developer contributions received from new developments, in addition to information on where these monies have been spent, is readily available to members of the public and other interested parties.
- 8.2 In addition to this statement, the expenditure of any contributions received from developers, including Section 106 obligations, is monitored by the Council in a transparent and accountable way. This includes the following:
 - Reports to the Council's Development Management Committee on planning applications will clearly identify the 'Heads of Terms' of any Section 106 agreement in the recommendation.
 - A copy of each Section 106 agreement will be placed on the public planning register together with the planning decision notice.
 - The Council will ensure that the sums due in accordance with the Section 106 agreement are paid on time and are earmarked for the specific project identified in the Section 106 agreement.
