The project is to redevelop the Farnborough Rotary Accessible Garden (FRAG), within the Cove Green Allotments. This will create a sustainable, welcoming space and entrance to the allotments, including a proper ramp for wheelchair access up to the main allotments.

The purpose is to offer an appropriate space to deliver Green Social Prescribing programmes and expand the supported volunteering for adults who are struggling with mental health.

Additional information:

The site improvement will enable the Community Support Worker to deliver the wider project of recruiting a team of garden buddies to work with her to get the first Blooming Minds programme started.

The 10-week programme will initially run three times a year, with six clients on each course. The aim is to recruit three garden buddies for each programme. Blooming Marvellous will base themselves at the site so that it has groups on site four days a week. Once established, the site will be available for other green projects to book and for RVS to run chargeable workshops.

A longer-term goal is to involve service users in growing produce for local food poverty projects.

RVS is the Council for Voluntary Service (CVS) in Rushmoor. Their role in the community is to champion volunteering and to help and support any voluntary or community group working in the borough of Rushmoor.

Some of the current area is closed off due to hazards, such as trip hazards from raised paving stones. This will include recycled plastic furniture, one of which will be wheelchair accessible. There will be new canopies, which will reuse existing frames. These will muffle aircraft and generator noise from the surrounding area, as well as reducing the Additional information: heat for both wildlife (birds and insects), and visitors during the summer months. A landscape gardener will tidy the beds and ensure all trees are safe. Another part of the project will be to fence off the adjacent office space to allow privacy and confidentiality for those using the space. Ongoing maintenance will be delivered by the volunteer gardening team. The Charity's aims are to support the work of the Frimley Health Foundation Trust, in providing the highest quality healthcare possible to the local community.
