Well-deserved honour for gymnastics academy founders



Huge congratulations to the founders and directors of the Rushmoor Gymnastics Academy in Aldershot for being awarded an MBE for services to gymnastics in the New Year Honours List.

Colin Wright formed the Camberley Gymnastics Club in 1974, with Bernie joining him in 1976. When the Aldershot ice rink came up for tender, the couple submitted a bid and was successful.

With lots of voluntary help, the

couple renovated the building in Pool Road, turning it into one of the finest gymnastics facilities in the country. It opened as the Rushmoor Gymnastics Academy in Aldershot on 22 July 2000, with a major international event, Great Britain v Belarus, which was the final trial for the Olympic Games.

In founding the Rushmoor Gymnastics Academy, Colin and Bernie have created a much-loved and highly

respected institution, which has brought huge enjoyment to so many people in our community.

For more than 50 years, their dedication to the development of women's gymnastics has been extraordinary, and their commitment has shaped the lives of thousands of children in the borough.

To mark the special occasion, our Leader, Councillor Gareth Williams and Managing Director Ian Harrison sent a letter of congratulations, offering the couple our warmest wishes on their richly deserved appointment as Members of the Order of the British Empire in the King's New Year Honours.



Claire Wright, the couple's daughter, said: "I couldn't be prouder of my parents at this time. I have watched them work so hard over the years and it is so nice to see them celebrated. They are so passionate about the sport and about helping children reach their full potential, whether that is learning a forward roll or reaching the Olympic Games and I am so happy that they have been recognised in this way. This is a very special moment for them and we look forward to celebrating together as a club but also as a family."

Use your vote on Thursday 7 May

Local elections are just around the corner, which means it is time for you to have your say on who represents you at Rushmoor Borough Council and Hampshire County Council.

There are some key dates in the countdown to the elections and if you are registered to vote, pollcards will be delivered from 27 March to 6 April.

The deadline to register to vote is Monday 20 April.

If you are going to be away for the election or can't get to a polling station, the deadline to apply for a postal vote is 5pm

on Tuesday 21 April. These will be posted out from 23 April.

The deadline to apply for a proxy vote (when you nominate someone to vote on your behalf) is 5pm on Tuesday 28 April.

You will have until 10pm on Thursday 7 May for the return of your completed postal vote statement and ballot paper, or to vote in person at your polling station.

Looking ahead to our summer Armed Forces Day weekend

We are thrilled that Aldershot and Farnborough have been chosen to host the prestigious Armed Forces Day National Event 2026 over the weekend of 27 and 28 June.

We will be organising a full programme of events and activities for the national celebrations, with support from the military, including a formal day on Saturday 27 June featuring a military march along Queens Avenue, displays and a funfair.

The focus of the Saturday will be on recognising those with connections to our armed forces - from cadets to veterans.

A community-focused day is planned for Sunday 28 June, including sport competitions, cultural activities, entertainment, stalls, and food.



In the meantime, you can get involved by sowing poppy seeds in your garden or nearby to create a carpet of poppies in time for Armed Forces Day weekend. Poppies self-seed easily, so there will be poppies blooming from previous years, but it would

be wonderful to add to them across Aldershot and Farnborough.

Child's play

Outdoor play has so many benefits for children's physical and mental health which is why we are taking action to upgrade some of our older playgrounds.

Over the next two years, we will be investing £400,000 on renewing equipment in several play areas in Aldershot and Farnborough and we'll keep you up to date on our progress in Arena.

Another way we are helping children to get active is through the 'Balance, Glide and Ride' programme.

Thanks to a grant from Hampshire County Council, trained coaches are working with Rushmoor schools to teach their children under six how to ride a balance bike. Once the children develop their confidence and master the art of balance, they then progress to a pedal bike and learn how to ride independently, without stabilisers.

The week-long course has been very well received, and children have enjoyed gaining a lifelong skill that helps them stay fit and physically active now and into adulthood.

As part of the grant, five schools have received their own balance bikes, allowing future year groups to



experience the joy of learning to ride.

Before you set off, you'll receive a safety briefing and will be asked to sign in and out.

All equipment will be provided.

Let us take care of your garden waste

Sign up for our garden waste collection service and say goodbye to the messy job of loading up the car and taking a trip to the household waste recycling centre.

As an added incentive, if you sign up before 31 March, you will pay £49 for the year and beat the price increase which comes in on 1 April.

After you sign up, we will deliver a 240-litre brown wheelie bin to your home – we recommend you clearly mark your bin with your house number and road name.

You can fill your bin with grass cuttings,

leaves, prunings, hedge trimmings and weeds.

We'll empty your bin every fortnight. On your collection day, please leave your bin on the edge of your property by 7am.

Garden waste will be taken to a composting centre near Basingstoke where it will be turned into the soil conditioner, Pro-Grow.

Your council tax and where it goes



Alongside our ambitious delivery plan, which you can read about on the opposite page, we have set a balanced budget for the council that will take us through to 2027.

The budget focuses on the things that we know are important to you and that allows us to continue to deliver good quality services.

Overall, we provide more than 100 local services, including collecting your rubbish and recycling, providing and maintaining parks and open spaces, play areas and leisure facilities, street cleaning, planning, housing, environmental health, town centres and events and community safety.

We also deliver bigger projects, such as regeneration and the planned new leisure centre (p11) and initiatives to create pride in place, help residents to lead healthy and active lives and support business growth in our towns.

This year's budget also includes additional funding for a number of key areas, including money to refurbish some of our playgrounds, (p5), to improve the look and feel of our towns, for events and to bring people together, as well as for a new online what's on calendar.

Council tax makes up just 18% of the money we need to do these things;



other sources include income from fees and charges and commercial investments, government grant and business rates.

Of the council tax you pay, 11% goes to us, 73% to Hampshire County Council, 12% to the police and 4% to the fire and rescue service.

This year, our share of your council tax will rise by 2.99%, or just over £7 for the average Band D taxpayer.

No change to our community governance arrangements

Thank you to everyone that took part in our survey where we asked if you would like to see parish (or town) councils or neighbourhood area committees introduced when local government reorganisation changes move ahead.

We received 610 responses to our survey, and we also spoke to lots of you at our public drop-in sessions.

Many of you showed support for the idea of an additional tier of community governance in Rushmoor with 29.8% keen to see parish council introduced, 22% wanting to see neighbourhood area communities and 18.5% feeling that they would like to see both considered. Another 21.1% did not support any changes and a further 8.5% were uncertain.

At a meeting of the council in January,

members considered the results and a report on the findings. Given the relatively low response that we had to the survey, they agreed that no changes would be taken forward at this time and that when a new unitary council is created in the future, this could be considered again.

Continuing to deliver what's important to you



We've recently updated our Delivery Plan, which sets out our priorities for the next two years as well as the key projects and activities that will help deliver them.

The plan has five key themes and builds on our successes over the last year.

Skills, economy and regeneration

Last month, we launched the Aldershot and Farnborough Growth Partnership with our business and community partners. We will be working together to shape the long-term future of our towns, attracting investment and delivering training to help residents get well-paid jobs.

With developments such as Union Yard continuing to welcome new businesses in Aldershot and a new Loungers café-bar coming to Farnborough, our focus on regeneration will continue.

Homes for all: quality living, affordable housing

We want to make sure that everyone has access to quality homes that are safe and affordable. We are working closely with local social housing providers, landlords and developers to improve

the standards and are encouraging the development of new and affordable homes on previously developed land.

Community and wellbeing: active lives, healthier and stronger communities

We know how important a new leisure centre in Farnborough is to you and as Arena went to print, we were busy preparing for the planning application to be considered (p11).

We will deliver events that bring the community together, including hosting the Armed Forces Day National Event 2026, which will be a moment of immense pride for our borough (p5).

Pride in place: clean, safe and vibrant neighbourhoods

We'll be increasing our efforts to tackle fly-tipping, environmental crime and antisocial behaviour and growing our team of place protection officers.

We'll also focus on refurbishing our playgrounds for families and children (p5).

The future and financial sustainability

We have set out a new budget, which makes sure that

our services and activities are affordable and of good quality.

As we look to the future, we, along with other councils in Hampshire, will continue to prepare for the new unitary councils due to come into

effect from April 2028 (see below).

Preparing for major changes to local councils

As you'll know, local councils are set to change from April 2028, and this will affect how your services are provided.

The changes, the biggest for 50 years, mean that instead of two councils delivering your services locally – Hampshire County Council and us, there will just be one unitary council covering a wider area than just Aldershot and Farnborough.

As Arena went to print, we were expecting an announcement from the government on what its final decision would be for Hampshire and the Isle of Wight.

During this time, we have been working closely with council colleagues across Hampshire on how the new arrangements could operate, including opportunities to improve future services.

In May 2027, you'll see elections for a 'shadow' council and these councillors will decide how the new council will run from 1 April 2028.

We will keep you updated on these important changes, but you also check on our website, www.rushmoor.gov.uk/localgovernmentreorganisation and on our social media accounts.

Our beautifully refurbished Aldershot crematorium



We were delighted to officially reopen Aldershot Crematorium at the end of the year and to welcome visitors back.

All funeral services are now taking place in our refurbished chapel, which can comfortably seat 100 mourners and has new picture windows which look across the memorial gardens.



The entire crematorium building has been fully modernised, and a covered entrance leads into the waiting room where mourners can gather before a service.

There are accessible toilets inside the building and outside for visitors to the grounds, along with some new internal features to help services run smoothly. One such feature is a semi-transparent voile curtain that can be closed at the committal part of the funeral service, allowing the coffin to be partially visible through the sheer fabric if desired. Television screens in the foyer and waiting room, also help to accommodate larger services.

As always, our experienced bereavement services team is here to welcome



you and help with any enquiries about services and memorials. Our new family room also offers a private space to meet with the team.

We'd also like to thank everyone who spent time with us over the festive season. There were more than 2,000 heartfelt messages left to loved ones on our memorial Christmas tree.

Farnborough leisure centre project springs into action

As Arena went to print, we were busy preparing for the Farnborough leisure centre planning application to be considered by our Development Management Committee.

Following engagement on the planning application, we are pleased to let you know that we have been able to include additional multi-use studio space in the building as part of the design. This means we will have a large studio that can accommodate up to 30 people and a second studio suitable for up to 20 people.

Last month, our Cabinet gave its approval to appoint Everyone Active as



the council's new leisure operator.

Everyone Active is the longest-established leisure contractor in the UK, having been set up in 1987, and already works with more than 65 local authorities managing more than 230 leisure and cultural centres across the UK.

The company will run our existing leisure facilities in Aldershot – the pools, lido and ski centre – before taking on the Farnborough Leisure Centre once open, (subject to planning permission and final costings). Look out for more information in our summer edition.

The centre is set to include a 25-metre swimming and 10-metre learner pool (with moveable floor) along with a 100+ fitness station gym, studio space, a spin studio, soft play and a café.

To allow building work to begin in the summer, you can expect to see



the closure of the Queensmead car park towards the end of June and for our development hoardings to go up around the site.

The Meads multi-storey car park will be available as the main town centre car park during the work.




